

∠IRECTIONS

From the East

Take the M9 from Edinburgh and follow brown and white signs for The Falkirk Wheel until you drive through Camelon on the Glasgow Road. Turn left onto Stirling Road at the Glasgow Road roundabout in Camelon. Drive under the railway bridge and continue along Stirling Road for approx 1/2 mile. Car Park D is on your left.

From the West

From the M80/A80 follow brown and white signs for The Falkirk Wheel until you drive through Camelon on the Glasgow Road. Turn left onto Stirling Road at the Glasgow Road roundabout in Camelon. Drive under the railway bridge and continue along Stirling Road for approx 1/2 mile. Car Park D is on your left.

From the North

Travel to Stirling following the A9 for Glasgow and follow brown and white signs for The Falkirk Wheel until you drive through Camelon on the Glasgow Road. Turn left onto Stirling Road at the Glasgow Road roundabout in Camelon. Drive under the railway bridge and continue along Stirling Road for approx 1/2 mile. Car Park D is on your left.
