ROBERT STEEDMAN

Partner, Morris & Steedman, architects and landscape architects. Governor, Edinburgh College of Art. Secretary, Royal Scottish Academy, 1983-91.

PROFESSOR DAVID WALKER

Hon. Professor of Architectural History, St Andrews University; formerly (to 1993) Chief Inspector of Historic Buildings, Scottish Development Department/Historic Scotland.

SIR ANTHONY WHEELER

Consultant (before 1986, Partner), Wheeler & Sproson, architects and town planners. President of the Royal Scottish Academy, 1983-90.

SIR WILLIAM WHITFIELD

Senior Partner, Whitfield Partners, architects, and former Professor of Architecture, Victoria University of Manchester.
