IMPORTANT CHANGES IN INSTITUTION EXAMINATION ARRANGEMENTS

ALL GRADUATES AND STUDENTS OF THE INSTITUTION (AND OTHERS CONSIDERING BECOMING CIVIL ENGINEERS) ARE ADVISED TO READ THIS CAREFULLY

The Council of Engineering Institutions will hold their first Part 1 Examination in October, 1967; and the Part 2 in April, 1968.

2. This examination, at the standard of a degree at a British University, will take the place of the traditional Examination of the Institution of Civil Engineers. The exemption list published in I.C.E.28. will also be superseded in 1970 by a C.E.I. list.

3. The various Parts of the Examination of the Institution of Civil Engineers will be discontinued after the following dates :

Part	I	October, 1968
Part	IB	October, 1969
Part	II	October, 1970

4. It takes a minimum of 6 years to become qualified to take the Professional Interview -3 years academic study and 3 years practical training and experience. At least 2 years of the practical training must be subsequent to passing or gaining exemption from the Institution Examination.

5. As a matter of urgency, Graduates and Students, and other candidates should study the list below to see how these examination changes will affect them. Unless they can meet the dead-lines and are elected Associate Members before 1st January, 1974, some will find themselves obliged to sit some part of the C.E.I. Examination.

AWARDS FOR GRADUATES AND STUDENTS

THE JAMES FORREST MEDAL

In 1897, Mr James Forrest asked that part of a sum of money subscribed by past and present members of the Council to bestow upon him as a token of their esteem be applied to the foundation of a medal to be awarded to the writer of the best Students' paper presented to the Institution. A silver medal is awarded in the ordinary course annually to the Graduate or Student of the Institution who contributes the best paper received from that class.

JAMES PRESCOTT JOULE MEDAL

The medal is placed every third year at the disposal of the Council of the Institution by the Town Clerk of Salford, acting on behalf of the trustees who administer the endowment fund, for award to a Graduate (who has not passed his 27th birthday) or a Student of the Institution for the best paper presented on an engineering subject, preferably one dealing with the transformation of energy.

The medal will next be awarded in 1970.

MILLER PRIZES

Instituted following a bequest made to the Institution by Joseph Miller (1797-1860), M.I.C.E., who was associated with marine engine design.

The income from the endowment fund is used annually to provide eight prizes, to the value of £30 each, for Graduates or Students of the Institution, on the same principles as the Telford Fund.

RUSSELL ALLIN PRIZE

Instituted in 1958, in memory of Russell Allin (1881-1957), M.I.C.E., a pioneer in soil mechanics.

The income from the endowment fund is used to provide an annual premium of £25 for a paper, by a Graduate or Student, dealing with foundations, either in general or in any of their aspects, e.g. theory, research, design, construction, testing, or with a particular form of foundation.

EXTRACTS FROM THE BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS

(a) By-laws

CONSTITUTION

2. THE INSTITUTION OF CIVIL ENGINEERS shall consist of Members and of Associate Members, all of whom are collectively referred to as Corporate Members. The Institution may also have attached to it Honorary Members, Associates, Graduates and Students, all of whom are collectively referred to as Non-Corporate Members.

The names of all Corporate and Non-Corporate Members shall be entered on the roll of the Institution (hereinafter referred to as " the Roll"). A member who changes his name shall thereupon inform the Secretary stating his former name and the Secretary shall amend the Roll accordingly.

7. GRADUATES shall comprise every person who has been admitted into the class of Graduates so long as his name is on the Roll as such. They shall be persons who with respect to their age, their educational attainments, their practical training, their employment and otherwise comply with such of the Regulations as apply to Graduates.

1. Expressions used in these Regulations shall have the meanings assigned to them by the By-laws of the Institution.

2. Upon producing evidence of having passed the Institution Examination or of holding qualifications recognised by the Council as exempting therefrom, a person under the age of 38 years at the date of lodgement of his application form, who satisfies the Council that he is in course of regular practical training or of obtaining experience in the design and/or construction of such works as are comprised within the profession of a civil engineer may be admitted as a Graduate on the recommendation (according to

ADMISSION OF GRADUATES AND STUDENTS

17. The admission to the classes of Graduates and Students of persons qualified in accordance with By-laws 7 and 8 respectively shall be by the Council. The continuance of any person as a Graduate or as a Student shall be subject to the Regulations.

PRIVILEGES OF GRADUATES AND STUDENTS

18. Graduates and Students shall be entitled to attend all meetings of the Institution other than the Annual General Meetings and Special General Meetings and to have the use of the Library and Reading Rooms (subject to the Rules). They shall be entitled to receive copies of such Institution publications as the rules may provide. Graduates and Students, in common with other members shall be eligible to compete for the Scholarships, Premiums and Prizes.

19. Graduates and Students shall have such other privileges as the Rules may provide.

(b) Regulations

It is very important for the form I.C.E. 3 to be forwarded to the Institution for registration as soon as the candidate enters into an agreement for practical training with his Employer.

From an Examination of the By-laws governing election to Associate Membership of the Institution, it will be seen that an Engineering Graduate of a University recognized by the Council can qualify for election :

- (a) by obtaining two years' practical training under agreement to an approved Engineer as a pupil, or engineering trainee, or as a graduate assistant under a Civil Engineer, and by having, in addition, one year of engineering experience;
- (b) in the absence of any agreement to obtain practical training, by obtaining four years' engineering experience.

Under (b) he generally obtains employment as an Assistant or as an assistant Engineer and acquires engineering experience of a practical character in the course of his employment, which may prove of limited extent in view of the fact that there is no obligation on the part of the employer. On the other hand, under (a), the Engineering Graduate who enters into a definite agreement for the purpose of being trained, is afforded opportunity of obtaining practical knowledge of engineering design and construction of a varied character both in the Engineer's drawing/or designing office, and in or upon actual constructional work.

When there is a formal undertaking by an Engineer to give such training, and he subsequently certifies that the trainee has availed himself properly of the opportunities given for such training, it will be seen that the Council accept a shorter qualifying period for election than in the case of an Engineering Graduate who does not enter into any agreement.

With regard to the Form I.C.E. 5 certifying that a person has obtained training under agreement, the Council are of the opinion that this has been used consistently in a manner for which it was not intended, there being ample evidence that it has been signed in retrospect by Engineers for the sole purpose of bringing a person's qualifications into line with the requirements of the By-laws governing election, when in fact no undertaking to provide practical training was given or entered into at the commencement of the period certified.
